Errors

Key principles

- Integrated management
- Kaitiakitanga
- Clear and consistent policy framework

Integrated management

- Sub-regional sections should align with catchment boundaries
- Connections between groundwater and surface water should be fully considered
- Water quantity and water quality should be considered together in setting allocation regimes

Kaitiakitanga

- Should be reflected in objectives
- Effects of activities on environment must be addressed
 - Effects on cultural values and customary use
- Functioning of natural systems should be protected
 - Over-allocated water bodies
 - Braided rivers
 - Wetlands (including hāpua)

Clear and consistent policy framework

- Provisions clear about intent and application
 - Objectives and strategic policies
- Consistent framework across region
 - Region-wide and sub-regional provisions
- Targeted policies and rules
 - Land use effects on water quality
 - Rules affecting wetlands

- Provision for infrastructure
- Definitions
