(a) the discharge is be carried out by a person who holds a GROWSAFE® Pilots' Agrichemical Rating Certificate and an aerial application organisation that is AIRCARE™ Accredited

5.23 For VTA use the clause above should be added

5.53 For fertiliser use the Report currently recommends:

3. The discharge is be carried out by a person who holds a GROWSAFE® Pilots' Agrichemical Rating Certificate or an organisation that holds an AIRCARETM Accreditation

This should be changed to read: The discharge is be carried out by an organisation that is AIRCARE[™] Accredited

- Neighbours notified
- Right product, right rate, right time, right place
- No adverse effects (No product off-target)
- No hassles!

How do Councils achieve their goals?

• Require pilot competence

• There's an <u>assumption</u> that if pilots are competent they will never cause adverse effects.....

• NZAAA promotes a different approach to give some assurance that Councils achieve their goals



An industry led best practice accreditation programme that is based on managing risk

The AIRCARE[™] Programme has three elements

- Pilot Competence (GROWSAFE[®] Pilots Agrichemical Rating Certificate)
- Aerial company has to be able to demonstrate that its pilots comply with your rules every time they go to work
- Independent audit

Certification vs Accreditation

Are they the same?


Certification is a personal qualification

Accreditation is achieved by a business Confirmation that an organisation has demonstrated compliance with selected rules and standards

Certification retained

Accreditation can be removed

AIRCARE™ and Plan linkages



Benefits

 Councils can have much greater <u>confidence</u> that its requirements are being met

 Critics can be assured that the environment is protected

• The aerial Ag industry and its land-based customers have an assured future

Risks to Council

 AIRCARE[™] is available to NZAAA members and non-members

 Cost of AIRCARE[™] to companies may initially be \$5K but with ongoing costs of \$1200 per annum once operators are established in the programme


Precedent

The Auckland Unitary Draft Plan requires AIRCARE[™] Accreditation as a condition of *permitted activity* to apply both agrichemicals and VTA by air
