My submission is that: Oppose Please state your reasons for supporting/opposing/amendments sought My reason(s) for supporting, opposing or requesting amendments to this specific provision are:

The sunset clause effectively banning low emission wood burners at 2019 or at the expiration of 15 year licence should be removed; this places too much of a limitation on residents' ability to plan with confidence their ability to heat homes indepedent of the National Grid. The earthquakes and snow events that have struck Chch since 2010 demonstrate the need to ensure non-electric heating options. While the possibility of Ultra Low Emission burners has been allowed for, this technology remains untested and is not available in the market place; further, if it becomes available the cost to install is likely to be prohibitive. Forcing the removal of modern - and previously approved - wood burners as at 2019 or after 15 years is unfair, limiting and represents a likely public health issue, and should not be built into the Plan.

I seek the following decisions from Environment Canterbury:

That the expiration of permits at either 2019 or after 15 years be removed, and an open end date be inserted instead; additional requirements could be inserted instead, including provisions for regular maintenance and cleaning to ensure contiued effeciency, but the blanket banning should be removed.
