#### I seek the following decisions from Environment Canterbury:

The University of Canterbury has (amongst others) existing Resouce consents for discharge of contaminants to AIr CRC120060 & CRC132534 for Generators 880 kW and 720kW, respectively. The Proposed CanterburyRegional Air Plan (pCARP) Rule 7.25 (4) say's

"The discharge can occur for maintenance and peak electricity network load management for a total of 500 hours per calendar year; and (5). Within the 500 hours per calendar year set out above, no more than 300 hours per calendar year can be for the purpose of peak electricity network load management".

The resource consent CRC120060 allows for not more than: 700 hours of use; 300 hours for peak electricity management and 'No limit' for when electricity supply is unavailable. The resource consent CRC132534 allows for not more than: 300 hours for peak electricity management and 'No limit' for when electricity supply is unnavailable.

Question - Does the 'pCARP' rule 7.25 revoke the existing resource consent criteria as detailed above?
