I wish to object to the following proposals put forward in the proposed long term plan: 1. Ashley River Control Scheme Proposal:- It appears the only reason for increasing the rate in Rangiora by over 100% is EC taking advantage of a much higher density area to increase its overall \$ intake substantially! The consultation document provides no explanation for the proposed exorbitant increase other than to make it more equitable?
