Cleaner Air:-

It is essential that home heating which is not dependent on reticulated supplies is used widely in Canterbury's towns, since reticulated supplies are the first things to fail in the event of extreme weather, floods or earthquakes, and a sufficient proportion of houses in any area must be able to be heated to keep the population as a whole warm. Consider the effect if the Christchurch earthquake had occurred during cold, wet, winter weather with the present high dependency on electric heating.

Rural burn-offs are an issue requiring more focus.

Industrial air pollution is not effectively dealt with.

What do you want Environment Canterbury to do?

Increase its funding and emphasis on developing, providing and installing ultra low emission wood burners. Encourage firewood suppliers to supply dry wood and set up an approval scheme for wood suppliers.

Fund research into alternatives to rural burn-offs.

Improve the response time to incidents of industrial pollution. For example, for many years there has been an intermittent problem with a smell around Timaru's

harbour, but by the time Ecan has moved to investigate, the conditions have changed and the smell gone.
