The air quality around and in the wind shadow of industrial sites needs to be able to be more rigorously monitored and be able to have the plant / site rectify problems asap, The operation / plant should stop until problems are rectified.

Do more research into similar operations overseas when bodies apply for consents,

If community liaison committees are part of the consent, let the appointed chair person have some power to make sure the communities complaints are acted upon.

There needs to be a more accurate measure of air quality to include PM (particulate matter) and chemical changes caused by interaction with PM and other chemicals floating in the atmosphere i.e. diesel exhaust fumes, chemicals used in air scrubbers, the passing of bio fumes through bio filters etc..

Some of these reactions make the PM more harmful to humans.
