Your submission

I believe ensuring that installing a log burner as an option for heating in the home is essential. The earthquake is a prime example of where electricity (or even gas) run heating was not reliable (ie. heat pumps). The heat from a heat pump or heater is no where near the quality of a log burner. And as a family planning to have children soon, I do hope we will have the option to install a log burner, which will be a reliable and constant source of heat for me and my children in our home (which was originally built in the 1940s but has had the open fire decommissioned before we purchased the place). Canterbury has very cold winters and, particularly in older houses, I don't believe anything beats a log burner for heat.

What do you want Environment Canterbury to do?

Ensure log burners are able to be installed in new houses and old houses being renovated. Ensure the 'clean air' log burners are affordable and omit the same amount of heat as other fires. Make log burners accessible to all Cantabrians as a source of heating in the home.
