1. Air discharges from industry Page 17

The burden of limitation has been heavily placed on households often to their detriment in creating cold living circumstances. Their pollutants are relatively low of harmful matter. Industry having more power and influence has been allowed to continue with serious discharges of air pollutants of much more damaging nature.

2. Shingle extraction Page 19

One one hand rivers, eg Waimakariri, are experiencing rising bed levels leading to the necessity of ever increasing work on flood protection. Removal of gravel from various "pits" in the province seems to bring a risk of ground water pollution particularly when breakthroughs to lower aquifers occur.

What do you want Environment Canterbury to do?

1 What you should do: Shift emphasis from relatively powerless domestic users and apply more stringent limitations with penalties as appropriate to industrial offenders.

2. (a) Close all "pit"operations and cancel existing permits.
result: reduced risk of harm to water supplies
(b) Legislate to make the source of gravel only from river

beds.

result: mitigation of rising bed levels and considerable lessening of flood risk and economies in the construction and maintenance of flood control works.
