My reason(s) for supporting, opposing or requesting amendments to this specific provision are:

In regard to air pollution in Christchurch

It appears the amendments are based on historical information which have been supported with an interpretation and extrapolation of the data.

The HAPINZ Study (updated 2012) estimated that in Canterbury each year there are the following health impacts from PM 10 :

- 1 435 adults (30+) die prematurely;
- 2 72 Cardiac hospital admissions;
- 3 108 Respiratory hospital admissions.

, "A simple request to the Ministry of Health under the Official Information Act in April of this year brought a response that 'we cannot identify whether a death was caused by exposure to PM10'. In other words, there is no evidence PM10 has caused any deaths at any time in New Zealand." Researcher Mike Butler

The HAPINZ study (updated 2012) appears to be based on data mainly collected in 2006 and extrapolated. Ecan data on Christchurch air pollution is showing a consistent trend since records began in the 1980s of lowering levels of air pollution. PM10 levels over the last 20 years since a standardised test began also indicate a steady trend.

The 2011 earthquake dust levels have affected the PM10 readings negatively.

Environment Canterbury (ECan) data from Woolston showed log-burner smoke was responsible for one high pollution day only since May. When combined with dust, high pollution days soared. *The Press 4-11-14*

The Christchurch earthquake has removed nearly all open fires and many old log burners. Natural attrition also occurs as older log burners become worn out are replaced, they don't last for a half century or more as a brick open fire might do. Many homeowners are choosing to replace log burners at that time with heat pumps or other appliances due to ease of use.

The issue of open fires and log burners contributing to pollution will naturally decay the same way as incandescing light bulbs are not the purchase of choice. There is no need to regulate to achieve the outcome.

Environment Canterbury need to look after the people of Christchurch who are in damp, cold homes with limited resources, the ability to keep warm in a Canterbury winter is an important way to keep a family healthy. To have to resort to electricity or gas heating especially if the gas heater is non flue and contributes to dampness is a negative outcome. A home need to be at a temperature that is above the level that sickness thrives.

I seek the following decisions from Environment Canterbury:

An amendment needs to be made to the banning of log burners that are older than 15 years.

Ecan needs to ask the Minister for the Environment to question the usefulness of meeting the standard of a maximum of 3 high pollution days a year by 2016 as ruled by the Minister for the Environment
