Cr Caygill thanked staff for the work done on the draft submission, and acknowledged that this was not easy due to the range of views expressed by Councillors and the technical nature of some the issues in the consultation document.

Cr Pham requested that the submission be amended to encourage central government to fund further research into phormidium and extend the National Policy Statement to include groundwater attributes.

With the submission due on 28 April it was agreed that a group of Councillors be delegated the authority to finalise and submit the submission.

8.5 Canterbury Water Management Strategy Zone Committees Annual Reports

Chairman Bedford introduced this item and welcomed to the meeting John Talbot, chair of the Orari-Temuka-Opihi-Pareora Water Management Zone Committee, and Simon Cameron, chair of the Upper Waitaki Water Management Zone Committee.

Kate White, chair of the Lower Waitaki South Coastal Canterbury Water Management Zone Committee was unable to attend this meeting. Cr Scott would present that Committee's Annual Report on her behalf.

The meeting adjourned between 10.45 and 11.05 am.

Cr Scott, with Cr Lambie, presented the <u>Lower Waitaki-South Coastal Canterbury</u> Water Management Zone Committee Annual Report 2016, on behalf of the zone committee chair, Kate White.

Cr Scott thanked Nic Newman and Elly Finnerty (Waitaki District Council) for their assistance to the zone committee.

Key points in the presentation included:

- The challenge involved in restoring the Wainono Lagoon. The lagoon is significant to Ngāi Tahu and home to a variety of birdlife. Council needs to trust the community to do the right thing with Wainono.
- Plan Change 5 will be important in giving effect to the Zone Committee's implementation plan.
- Appreciation of the work done the Upper Waitaki Zone Committee and Cr Skelton that had greatly assisted the Lower Waitaki zone committee.

John Talbot, chair of the <u>Orari-Temuka-Opihi-Pareora</u> Water Management Zone Committee, presented the zone committee's Annual Report and highlighted the following points:

- The addition of Temuka to the name of the committee to acknowledge its importance to the rūnanga.
- The area south of the Orari to Timaru is over allocated and stream depletion rules will have an impact on flow reliability for irrigation.
- Interest in how the adaptive management history for the Opihi will be incorporated into planning.
- The work being done on management options for the Washdyke area around coastal erosion, industrial activities and potential pollution.
- The Committee is looking at issue of water management to help protect the limestone rock art in South Canterbury.

Mr Talbot raised some issues of concern to the zone committee:

- Some property owners are still not aware that they are in a drinking water management zone. People will come on board when they can see a clear connection with their business interests. This was evidenced by the interest in information sessions arranged by industry groups.
- Due to the time taken to collect the technical assessments for the models a
 request was made for a time extension for the zone committee to develop
 some scenarios. [Councillors supported extending the deadline from
 September to December 2017. A written request to for the extension was
 requested].

Olivia Smith and Nic Newman were thanked for their work in support of the zone committee.

Simon Cameron, chair of the <u>Upper Waitaki</u> Water Management Zone Committee presented the committee's Annual report. He thanked Nic Newman, Barbara Nicholas, Olivia Smith and the team for their hard work.

Three matters were highlighted:

- The problems caused by freedom campers in the Upper Waitaki zone are increasing as the number of visitors increases. Control is difficult, in part due to the number of agencies involved. Mr Cameron suggested that the Regional Council could assist in a facilitation role to co-ordinate action and obtain central government funding.
- The Ministry for Primary Industries is funding the removal of wilding pines in a project covering 500,000 hectares over 14 years. It will be interesting to see the effects on catchment from the removal of the pine trees.
- The need to consider how best let the public know about the work being done in the Upper Waitaki Zone, as there is still a lack of understanding that work is being done.
