Title

Appointment of Decision Makers to consider and decide resource consent applications

Purpose

To appoint a Hearing Commissioner to hear and decide resource consent applications CRC175507, CRC175508, CRC175509, CRC175510, CRC176030 to be held by Lyttelton Port Company Limited.

Recommendations

That the Committee, in regard to resource applications CRC175507, CRC175508, CRC175509, CRC175510, CRC176030, *to be held by Lyttelton Port Company Limited:*

- (a) Appoints Sharon McGarry as a Hearings Commissioner, and member and Chair of the Hearing Panel under s34A of the Resource Management Act 1991; and
- (b) Appoints Peter Atkinson as a Hearings Commissioner, and member of the Hearing Panel under s34A of the Resource Management Act 1991; and
- (c) Delegates to Sharon McGarry and Peter Atkinson pursuant to s34A(1) Resource Management Act 1991, the function, powers and duties required to: deal with any preliminary matters; hear; and decide the applications

Proposal

Background

Lyttelton Port Company is applying for consents in respect of its proposed Te Aawaparahi Bay reclamation project which involves the proposed construction of a reclamation and piled wharf totalling approximately 24 hectares in size. The project will be undertaken in Whakaraupō/Lyttelton Harbour in two stages:

- Stage 1 will involve the construction of approximately 5 hectares of reclamation via end tipping; and
- Stage 2 will involve the construction of approximately 16 hectares of reclamation, by:
 - creating a perimeter bund around the remaining area to be reclaimed; and
 - the bulk filling of the area behind the bund.

The consent applications are for coastal permits to disturb and discharge seabed material relating to the reclamation; and to discharge water, stormwater or any contaminants into the coastal marine area; and dust to air.

The applications were publicly notified. Seven submissions were received, one has now been withdrawn; and four wish to be heard. Two support the proposal, and 4 are neutral.

Discussion

The proposed commissioners, Sharon McGarry as Chairman and Hearing Panel member; Peter Atkinson as a Hearing Panel member; have satisfied Council staff they have the necessary criteria, including technical ability, RMA Accreditation certification, availability and timeframe commitments to carry out the duties required.

Legal compliance

S34A of the Resource Management Act 1991 allows Council to delegate functions to Hearing Commissioners appointed by the Canterbury Regional Council.

The Regulation Hearing Committee appoints Hearing Commissioners in relation to consent authority matters under the Resource Management Act 1991.
