

# **Title**

Appointment of Decision Makers to consider and decide resource consent applications

# **Purpose**

To appoint Hearing Commissioners to hear and decide resource consent applications CRC175344 and CRC175345 to be held by Canterbury Landscape Supplies Limited.

# Recommendations

That the Committee, in regard to resource consent applications CRC175344 and CRC175345 to be held by Canterbury Landscape Supplies Limited:

- (a) Appoints Sharon McGarry as a Hearings Commissioner, and member and Chair of the Hearing Panel under s34A of the Resource Management Act 1991; and
- (b) Appoints John Iseli as a Hearings Commissioner, and member of the Hearing Panel under s34A of the Resource Management Act 1991; and
- (c) Delegates to Sharon McGarry and John Iseli pursuant to s34A(1) Resource Management Act 1991, the function, powers and duties required to: deal with any preliminary matters; hear; and decide the applications; and in the event of an inequality of votes provides Sharon McGarry with a casting vote.

# **Proposal**

# **Background**

Canterbury Landscape Supplies Limited have applied for retrospective consent to discharge contaminants including odour and dust to air, and contaminants to land that may enter water from a compost operation at 97 Diversion Road, Swannanoa.

Materials to be composted include sawdust and bark, dewatered paunch grass, and scoured wool fragments. Other materials that may be composted include green waste, egg shell, compostable packaging with some residual food waste, grease trap waste, biosolids and leaf litter.

The maximum quantity of composting materials stored or being processed on the site at any time will be 40,000 cubic metres, with approximately 16,000 tonnes of compost produced each year.

A duration of 35 years is sought.

The applications were publicly notified. 41 submissions have been received, with 27 wishing to be heard. The majority are in opposition to the applications, with three in support.

A hearing is to be held early December 2017.

## **Discussion**

The proposed commissioners, Sharon McGarry as Chairman and Hearing Panel member; John Iseli as a Hearing Panel member; have satisfied Council staff they have the necessary criteria, including technical ability, RMA Accreditation certification, availability and timeframe commitments to carry out the duties required.

# Legal compliance

S34A of the Resource Management Act 1991 allows Council to delegate functions to Hearing Commissioners appointed by the Canterbury Regional Council.

The Regulation Hearing Committee appoints Hearing Commissioners in relation to consent authority matters under the Resource Management Act 1991.
