I strongly oppose discontinuing <u>both</u> the 107 and 108 bus routes. This would leave a large part of the north west with **no public transport options at all.** Considering there are a large number of school children and older people that completely rely on these buses it seems incredible that both buses are to be discontinued.

Plus two new subdivisions are being built on Cavendish Road and Gardiners Roads leaving even more people with no public transport. Do you really want more cars on the road when your vision is about sustainability in our region.

In addition as many parts of this area are on the city fringe with roads that are either 80 km zones and no footpaths. or both, the alternatives for school children in particular to use alternate methods to get to and from school are limited and have safety issues associated.

Why can't the routes be combined, smaller buses be used or even the timetable adjusted (for example stopping weekend use and running the buses hourly) to make them buses more economical rather than both discontinued? Bus patronage would also be increased if services were run directly into the central city rather than requiring users to change buses at Northlands and take two buses for their trip. This is a significant deterrent to bus usage for many in the suburbs compared to the past model of bus routes that all led directly to the central city.
