Comments: Every person using public transport, cycling or walking and not a private motor vehicle, reduces road congestion, causes less road construction and maintenance expenditure and contributes less to green house gas emissions. Therefore, the Regional Council should be promoting public transport vigorously. Increasing fares will only reduce the number of people using buses. Closing routes will reduce patronage. Rates spent on public transport benefit everyone. The 535 Eastgate-Lyttelton-Rapaki route is of benefit for people in the northern bays and for people wishing to go to Eastgate. The route should be retained and extended to Governors Bay. The 535 route also provides two more bike racks for people taking bikes through the tunnel. Dominic van Uden of Diamond Harbour has proposed the development of a public transport shuttle, using volunteer drivers, providing a local service around Diamond Harbour and Church Bay to take people to and from the ferry. The Community Association supports this initiative and requests that the Council provides support in the form of a public transport subsidy and/or assists with the purchase of a shuttle vehicle.

We would also like the Council to help reduce fares to Quail Island. They are currently \$30/adult and \$15 per child for a return trip which is prohibitively expensive for many families. Council could provide a subsidy for this or preferably include it within the same subsidy scheme that reduces prices on Lyttelton – Diamond Harbour route.
