I believe ECan needs to do more to address climate change.

I acknowledge that ECan has a section in the LTP "Climate Change Integration". Its goal "make it easier for stakeholders and the public to know what we know about the potential impacts of climate change and what we are doing to help Canterbury adapt to it". It is funded at only 2% of the Hazards, Risk and Resilience budget, at <\$600K per annum for a Canterbury population of >600K. This seems barely sufficient to print and mail information to each household, let alone research & prepare that information, and disseminate it in any other way.

ECan currently "assumes the Government's stand on the statutory role for regional councils for climate change will remain as 'adaptation' to the effects of climate change, and not 'mitigation' of greenhouse gas emissions." Given the 10 year timeframe of the LTP and the change in central government, I would challenge that view. ECan must go beyond its current climate change mandate if it is to fulfil its purpose: "Facilitating sustainable development for the Canterbury region" – how is anything other than carbon neutrality sustainable?
