Conditions:	
<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. All vessels must be marked with lettering or numbering at least 90mm high above the waterline, visible to the naked eye from 50 metres.</li><li>2. All personal watercraft are to be marked with unique numbers and the controlling body is required to maintain a register for these numbers, including, owner name, date of birth, home address.</li><li>3. The controlling body is to supply the details of the owner of the PWC to the Harbourmaster, Maritime New Zealand, or the Police within 7 days of being required.</li><li>4. Should the race number be removed from the PWC the registration number of the towing trailer is to be affixed in accordance with part 20 of the Navigation Safety Bylaw 2016.</li><li>5. All members of the Canterbury Jet Sports Club are to be advised of the Harbourmaster's Approval.</li></ol>
