application, which seeks resource consent for the discharge of network stormwater across the Christchurch City area as a non-complying activity.

The primary goals outlined by the application are defined by the *Christchurch Surfacewater Strategy*, 2009 – 2039 (CCC, 2009, with these goals re-iterated in the application document, these are outlined for the purposes of our submission below:

- 1. Improve the water quality of our surface water resources.
- 2. Reduce the adverse effects of flooding.
- 3. Improve the ecosystem health of surface water resources.
- 4. Restore Tangata Whenua values associated with surface water resources.
- 5. Support a range of recreation activities on and around waterways.
- 6. Protect heritage values associated with surface water.
- 7. Protect and enhance the landscape values of surface water.
- 8. Support community involvement in surface water management.
- 9. Manage stormwater in an efficient manner that supports Goals 1 to 8.

The Club has reviewed the application made under CRC190445 and generally support the principle of the application with regard to the both surface water quality and surface water quantity outcomes as they accord to the goals outlined above, with particular regard to goals (1), (2), (3) and (5)

With regard to water quality, the use of the Otakaro Avon River is critical in the Club's ongoing existence in the City at its Kerrs Reach location, allowing for athlete members to train in a location that is convenient and accessible.

A high level of water quality is important in ensuring the viability of the Kerrs Reach training location ongoing, for both the health and safety of athletes utilising the water resource and for ensuring the day to day operations of the club are able to continue at this location.

The applicant (being the Christchurch City Council) seeks to improve water quality within the Otakaro Avon River and as such the Club supports the outcomes sought by the application in this regard.

The Environmental Monitoring Programme proposed under the application is considered suitable in ensuring water quality outcomes are achieved for the duration of the consent.

The transition from the current interim consent (CRC090292) to the finalised Comprehensive Stormwater Network Discharge Consent is considered a positive progression in improving water quality in the Otakaro Avon River catchment and across the wider Christchurch City area.

In terms of water quantity the application seeks to ensure discharge flows are managed on site to ensure flows are attenuated where suitable to reduce stormwater pressures on the waterway. Whilst flood flows are not typically an issue for the Club these measures will ensure that the Clubs operations are not adversely affected by high rainfall events.

Overall the Club is supportive of the application in its current form.
