### 4.1 Better Public Transport Christchurch

Jackie Simons, chair of the Woolston Residents Association, and Paul McMahon presented a petition questioning the recent Council decision to cut bus services. People in the Woolston and Bromley communities will lose two bus services that will be replaced by a new 155 service.

While there was support for the 155 service, they were very concerned that it was proposed to run the service only 3 times a day. The people in these communities rely on the bus service and the cuts will cause people to be isolated. They were also concerned about the way consultation is undertaken by local government and encouraged the Council to come and talk to the community, rather than relying on people to make submissions.

A letter of support for the petition from Christchurch City Councillor Yani Johanson was tabled.
