# 7. Update on Stage 3 of the Rapanui-Shag Rock Cycleway Committee Comment

1. This update did not go ahead at this time. Staff will provide an update at a future meeting when more complete information on the Rapanui-Shag rock Cycleway project is available.

# 8. Immediate Steps Biodiversity Projects

#### **Committee Comment**

- 1. Lance Kenyon outlined the process undertaken to assess the Immediate Steps applications.
- 2. Discussion was held about:
  - a. the long term vision of the Grassland Park and the need to keep in mind future expansion of the Park
  - b. being able to gain public access to the water in the areas being planted on the Cashmere and Otukaikino Streams
  - c. a potential biodiversity project on a drain on ECan land which connects the Otukaikino Reserve Wetland to the Otukaikino River. Les Wanhalla advised the water in that area was culturally sensitive to Tūāhuriri and the possibility of a sacred Urupā located in that area.
- 3. A Zone Committee field trip to the wetland/reserve will be organised by staff, to take place during November 2018.
- 4. The Biodiversity Working Group recommended that for two of the projects, which have a three year duration, that funding be allocated for one year and then applications be submitted again for the following two years. A discussion then followed about the pros and cons of this approach.

  - 3.1 allocate years two and three of the Otukaikino Stream and Dry Grasslands projects now (staff recommendation); or

3.2 prioritise funding the second and third years of the Otukaikino Stream and Dry Grasslands projects in 2019 and 2020 respectively.
