Purpose

1. To appoint an Independent Hearing Commissioner to consider, hear and decide resource consent application CRC175136 lodged by Pigeon Pay Aquaculture Limited.

Recommendations

Background

- 2. Pigeon Bay Aquaculture Limited has applied for resource consent to renew coastal permits for a marine farm located in Pig Bay, Banks Peninsula.
- The application is for ongoing occupation of the Coastal Marine Area and disturbance, placement of structures and deposition on the seabed; to extend the occupation seawards while surrendering the inside area; and to extend to the south west with an additional block of long lines

Purpose

- 1. Appointment of an external Decision Maker to decide a non-notified resource consent application that is an application made by Environment Canterbury, or an Environment Canterbury staff member, immediate family of a staff member, or Councillor.
- To appoint an Independent Commissioner to consider and decide the non-notification consent applications CRC190566, CRC190567, and CRC190568 lodged by Kaikōura District Council.

Recommendations

That the Regulation Hearing Committee in regard to resource consent application(s) CRC190566, CRC190567, and CRC190568 to be held by Kaikōura District Coucil:

- 1. Appoints Sharon McGarry as a Hearings Commissioner, and member of the Hearing Panel under s34A of the Resource Management Act 1991; and
- 2. Delegates to Sharon McGarry pursuant to s34A(1) Resource Management Act 1991, the function, powers and duties required to: deal with any preliminary matters; hear; and decide the resource consent applications.

Background

The Kaikōura earthquake in November 2016 caused extensive damage to parts of Kaikōura's waste water network. Kaikōura District Council (the applicant) seek to install a new sewer line along a stretch of Beach Road (SH1), Kaikōura. A number of pressure sewer pump stations will also be installed on private properties; these will be connected to the Beach Road trunk main. Resource consents are required to excavate land, take water for dewatering purposes, and discharge both the dewatering water and construction phase stormwater to the waste water treatment plant or network. The applicant has therefore applied for the following consents:

CRC190566 Land Use Permit (s9) To undertake earthworks over an aquifer

CRC190567 Water Permit (s14) To take groundwater for short term dewatering

CRC190568 Discharge Permit (s15) To discharge construction phase stormwater to land

AND

To discharge dewatering water to KDC waste water treatment plant.

Reasons for recommendation that an external decision maker be appointed:

Environment Canterbury has had significant input into the application. Environment Canterbury Planner Joe Harrison (since departed) wrote the initial application on behalf of Kaikoura District Council in his role as Territorial Authority Liaison. The application has been submitted by Mr. William Loppe, Rebuild Programme Manager at Kaikoura District Council.

To ensure transparency of process it is recommended an Independent Commissioner should consider and decide the non-notification consent application.
