Purpose

Recommendations

Background

- Fulton Hogan Limited has objected to the compliance monitoring costs associated with resource consent CRC175099.
- The costs have been incurred in the monitoring of the discharge into land of contaminated water in the Hapuku River, north of Kaikoura

Proposed Commissioners

 Cindy Robinson has satisfied Council staff she has the necessary criteria, including technical ability, RMA Accreditation certification, availability and timeframe commitments to carry out the duties required.

Legal compliance
