Red Bus fully supports the core vision, network development elements and top priorities of the new RPTP, particularly:

- Recognising the time is right for reinvestment in public transport
- Focusing on meeting customer needs
- Growing patronage
- Improving accessibility
- Encouraging innovation and being willing to test concepts and technology
- The network routes, which incorporate more direct city transport links.

In our view the public transport funding proposed in this Annual Plan is the <u>minimum</u> necessary. A significant increase in funding is a critical first step to lift the public transport fund out of the red and to support the achievement of the RPTP initiatives in order to deliver the desired community benefits.

We believe the recovery of the central city and stabilisation of the broader transport network alongside recent transport technology developments sets the scene for a reinvigoration of public transport, but will require a range of interventions that necessitate ongoing investment. We would like to see more funding allocated.

Red Bus fully supports the Annual Plan's commitment to fund the recovery and growth of public transport by investing in improved customer service using new technologies such as electric buses, higher service frequency and improved customer experience.

As Christchurch's public transport environmental pioneers, Red Bus has demonstrated its support of the Annual Plan's commitment to carbon reduction by investing in carbon reduction initiatives, including a heavy investment in electric buses. We've reduced our fleet kilometre carbon emissions by 9.9% since 2015 and will continue to lead the way by reducing our future emissions.

We've consistently led Environment Canterbury's customer service scores since they were introduced in 2012. We look forward to continued collaboration with Environment Canterbury and other partners to develop and deliver better and more effective customer solutions in future.

We call for urgent progress to reduce transport emissions as part of a broader response to climate change. Technological developments, such as electric buses, combined with increased ridership from service improvements and increased promotion, will enhance local air quality and reduce the transport carbon footprint for city travellers. Increased ridership will also improve community health outcomes because every public transport trip includes some walking time. Red Bus is actively encouraging people to choose public transport and to choose it more often via our promotional activities.

We suggest that the air improvement benefit from the RPTP planned transition to a zero emission fleet for urban passenger transport be added into the Air Quality section to reflect the broader impact of public transport on the Canterbury air shed.
