Southern Woods Nursery Limited (Southern Woods) confirms that it:

Opposes the applications;

- Wishes to be heard in support of our submission;
- Will consider presenting a joint case at the hearing if others make a similar submission; and
- Would welcome the opportunity to discuss our issues with the applicant by way of a prehearing meeting.

Southern Woods generally oppose the applications in the absence of greater assurances regarding potential dust, noise and groundwater effects.

#### The reasons for Southern Woods' submission are:

Southern Woods is one of the South Island's largest plant nurseries, producing a range of trees, shrubs and grasses for projects large and small.

Located in at 1002 Robinsons Road we are very close to the planned quarry (approximately 250m according to Fig 3 of AEE) and in direct line with the prevailing north easterly wind.

We specialise in supplying healthy, vibrant, plants for a wide range of projects across New Zealand and believe there is a high potential for plant damage caused by increased levels of dust from the proposed quarry.

The plants we grow include native revegetation plantings, landscaping, forestry, fruit and nut trees, as well as ornamental trees and shrubs for around the house. Some of these varieties are more susceptible to dust damage than others.

The foundation principles of our business are: our people, our products and our community, with a key focus on the environment. We are concerned that a proposal such as the Roydon quarry, with its potential for adverse effects on our business and customers, is inconsistent with our company's principles.

Potential adverse effects of greatest concern:

- 1. Amenity Impact and Human Health:
  - We believe that with the likelihood of increased levels of dust and the risk of it making its way from the quarry to the nursery due to the proximity of the quarry and the prevailing wind conditions there is both an amenity impact and a potential health risk to our staff and our customers.



- We are also concerned that the proposed conditions exempting noise from traffic and allowing for, what seems to be, ongoing construction noise levels due to the fact that the relevant parts of the proposal will occur throughout its lifecycle, have the potential to create an adverse noise environment over and above the noise already being experience at our site from the Sothern Motorway extension works.

#### 2. Plant Health:

- We believe that with the level of dust and the risk of it making its way from the quarry to the nursery there is a health risk to our plants as well as the likelihood of the dust being a "nuisance" in terms of the plants for sale in the retail centre (located directly on the corner of Robinsons Road and the Southern Motorway) and the plants being grown on in the nursery the 7 hectares that make up the corner of Robinsons Road.

#### 3. Nuisance:

- The dust contamination on the site is seen as being of high risk of being a nuisance to both plants and people (staff and customers). As well as being detrimental to vehicles and plant used to run the nursery on a 7 day a week basis.

#### 4. Groundwater:

- We are concerned about the potential for ground water contamination given the nurseries reliance on groundwater and the limited information in the application regarding any potential impacts on groundwater. There appears to be significant reliance on modelled water levels and the existence of a buffer between the extraction activities and the ground water, which does not appear to have been substantiated on the site. We note the conditions requiring that the separation be maintained but are concerned as to how that might be monitored or enforced?

#### 5. Commercial:

- All of these risks indicate that the quarry would likely have a detrimental impact on the commercial effectiveness of the nursery via increase risk to plants and people, likely additional costs (faster degradation of plant and machinery) and finally the likely commercial impact of the reduction in quality of plants for sale in the retail centre.

### Southern Woods request that the consent authorities make the following decision:

- Decline the application; or in the alternative,
- If the proposal is to proceed, impose conditions on the relevant consents that:
  - Require that dust generation be mitigated so that there be no increase in the dust generated beyond the applicants site;
  - Require a monitoring programme to confirm the ambient dust conditions over a 6 month period, including monitors in the southwestern corner of the site;
  - Incorporate ambient dust monitoring results in the dust management plan to bench mark dust conditions at the site;
  - Do not exempt excessive noise within 250m of the entrance to the site or enable construction noise levels that will apply continuously over the life of the guarry.
  - Provide greater clarity over groundwater protection controls and what other "suitable vegetation" might be for rehabilitation; and
  - Add (preferably volunteered) assurances and offered penalties or compensation if requisite thresholds for dust, groundwater buffers and noise are breached by the activity so that obligations and their enforcement can be simplified.
