Consent comment:

Reject the quarry, or impose the following conditions: Fulton Hogan pay the full cost of comprehensive 3rd party monitoring of the following environmental factors, any breach of any of these conditions results in immediate termination of the resource consents, and fines to pay for remediation of any damages. 1. Air quality must be continuously monitored on the boundaries to ensure the dust mitigation activities being carried out by Fulton Hogan are effective. The air quality at the boundaries must not be measurably worse than the ambient air quality in those locations. This should include Respirable Crystalline Silica, PM10 and PM2.5. There should be NO increase in nuisance dust levels outside the boundaries. 2. Groundwater should be checked weekly for contamination for the life of the quarry and quarterly for 10 years after remediation, at bores along both sides, any spillage within the quarry boundary (eg, diesel) should be reported immediately and the spill zone cleaned. 3. Sound levels outside 7am until 5pm should not be above ambient noise outside the quarry, eg the noise level from the quarry on any boundary should not exceed the nonquarry level at that boundary. Both peak and average. 4. All traffic to go via southern motorway even when travelling to destinations to the north or west. 5. Any water take from bores on the site should be from bores shallower than 20m, so they will not affect existing bores in the vicinity. 6. All trucks leaving monitored to ensure load is covered.
