Submission

1. There is widespread use of the term "spring fed plains stream" in the document.
2. It is quite common for the document to describe gullies that are not fed by springs as "spring fed streams"
3. Many of these only carry water in occasional flood events, "median" levels, if averaged out between years or within a year would be very close to zero.
4. In relation to the above it would seem that at this time looking at Plan Change 7, should enable corrections to be made to the many errors made above.
5. My submission is that the accuracy of the description of "spring fed streams" should be checked and the classification should be changed to more accurately reflect their true nature.
