**Fulton Hogan Ltd - Proposed Roydon Quarry**

Selwyn District Council lodged a submission on the proposed Roydon Quarry. The submission identified that we wished to be heard in support of the submission lodged.

Subsequent to lodging the submission we have now had the opportunity to review the Section 42A reports and the evidence of the applicant, particularly that of Mr Eric Roland van Nieuwkerk, Senior Hydrogeologist at Golder Associates (NZ) and Dr Lisa Caryn Scott, Canterbury Regional Council.

Having reviewed this evidence, including recommendations included in the evidence, the Selwyn District Council no longer seeks to be heard in support of its submission.

We ask the hearing panel, if consent is granted, impose conditions that address the following matters:

1. That groundwater monitoring is implemented throughout the lifetime of the quarry and appropriate mitigation measures taken if a groundwater contamination plume develops from the site.
2. That two additional monitoring wells are installed on the site at the boundary. These should be installed downgradient in respect to the groundwater flow and assist in identifying groundwater quality changes. This is consistent with Paragraph 69 of the evidence of Mr Eric Roland van Nieuwkerk.
3. That water quality monitoring undertaken from the Selwyn District Council public water supply well, M36/7575 be included within the applicants monitoring report and any trends identified in relation to the quarry operation are noted and mitigated if the effects are adverse. This is consistent with Paragraph 88 of the evidence of Dr Lisa Caryn Scott.
