Reservation: 1. Uplifting of 5 knot speed limit within 200 metres of the shore or any structure, or within 50 metres of any other vessel. (refer to safety conditions)
Conditions:
Publication of notice of Reservation: Notification to known affected groups; notifications on appropriate websites and social media; notices at known boat ramps and key access points. Advertising in Christchurch Star, Bay Harbour News and Akaroa Mail at least 7 days prior to the event. Lyttelton Port Company Operations to be advised at least 7 days prior then 24 hours prior to the event.

A copy of the Temporary Reservation Certificate to be carried by: Scotty Moore or delegate
Safety conditions: 1. The Surf Lifesaving New Zealand Safety Plan and Canterbury Jet Sports Club SOP is to be complied with. 2. A jet ski with an authorised marshal is to be on the water in the vicinity of the race area ensuring the area delineated on the attached map is clear of non-authorised vessels and or persons at all times the race is being conducted. 3. Should any unauthorised vessel or person enter the course whilst racing is in progress, all craft are to return to the standard rules of navigation as prescribed by Maritime Rule 22 and 91, and Part 2 of the Navigation Safety Bylaw 2016, all participants are to be fully briefed on the safety plan and requirement to comply with the Maritime rules 22 and 91 prior to commencing the race. 4. All PWCs are to remain outside of the main navigation channel if vessels are entering or leaving the Port of Lyttelton. 4.No wake is to be created near moored vessels in Naval Point or Akaroa Harbour.
Temporary Reservation shall not take effect if: Conditions above are not met.
