2. This is a submission on the following applications by Bathurst Coal Limited (**Applicant**) for resource consents to continue operating and expand the Canterbury Coal Mine at Bush Gully Road, Malvern Hills, in the Selwyn District (**Applications**):
 - (a) RC185622 – to expand Canterbury Coal Mine, retrospective and future;
 - (b) CRC184166 – to undertake earthworks in the high soil erosion risk area, and earthworks and vegetation clearance in riparian margins, including the removal of wetland vegetation;
 - (c) CRC200500 – to discharge contaminants to air (fugitive dust) from within the mine operations area;
 - (d) CRC201366 – to take surface water from artificial ponds, to divert surface run-off resulting in changes to sub-catchment boundaries and to store water in artificial ponds;
 - (e) CRC201367 – to take groundwater (via drainage systems);
 - (f) CRC201368 – to discharge sediment and mine influenced water, drainage water and residual contaminants from the treatment of water, to Tara Stream/Wetland; and
 - (g) CRC203016 – to discharge coal combustion residuals, lime products and mussel shells to land and to water (artificial watercourses).

6. The Submitter is General Manager Domestic Operations for Bathurst resources Ltd
7. The Submitter supports the Application for the specific reasons set out below.

 - (a) The Canterbury Coal Mine is a long-standing existing activity in the Selwyn District;
 - (b) It is a major local employer and makes a significant contribution to the local and national economies;
 - (c) It supplies coal to several major agricultural businesses and plays an important part in the domestic supply chain;
 - (d) The Applicant is a well-established mine operator across New Zealand;
 - (e) There are a range of existing resource consents in place for the Canterbury Coal Mine that authorise a substantial baseline of effects;
 - (f) The additional adverse effects as a result of the Applications are appropriate in this location as the mine is close to the end users and situated on either forestry land or lower values farm land, this negates the need for the coal to be transported from the West Coast 200 Km away therefore reducing the carbon impact of long distance freight;
 - (g) The Applications are consistent with the relevant provisions in the applicable regional and district planning documents; and
 - (h) The Applications represent sustainable management of resources:
 - (i) The rehabilitation that Bathurst completes at Canterbury Coal is of a very high standard:
 - (j) The mine expansion will mine through old underground workings that do leach and drain into the adjacent waterways. By mining through these areas these issues disappear and no longer leach into the waterways;
