Reasons comment:

COVID-19 has opened our eyes to having more locally produced goods in New Zealand,

and not relying on imports from abroad. As a service provider to most of the mines in New Zealand; we have seen the outcome of mines closing and coal being imported rather than directing 100% of previously supplied coal to local providers.
