**Reasons comment:**

The long term nature of the consents (20+ years) is extremely concerning as scientific

evidence already shows that fossil fuels such as coal have made significant detrimental effects. To continue extracting and burning coal is against ECan's long term plan objectives. What is the point of LOS 23 in assisting communities to mitigate against climate change , and policy on improving air quality, if the council allows the coal industry to continue?
