Subject: Forest & Bird Youth submission to all resource consent applications from Bathurst Coal Limited.

Forest & Bird Youth wish to be heard in support of this submission.

We are facing a climate and ecological crisis. Without urgent action, we face the very real risk of ecological and societal collapse due to the enormous stress placed upon our planet by the destructive actions currently being undertaken by humans.

It is crucial that action is taken immediately to halt these environmental stressors being placed on nature. This entails limiting greenhouse gas emissions, reducing pollutant input into the environment, and introducing more sustainable practices for the use of our limited natural resources. It also means that local and central government need to think very carefully about what actions are taking place in their jurisdiction, and whether these actions are environmentally sustainable or not.

In the case of Bathurst Coal Limited's resource consent applications, Forest & Bird Youth strongly believes that if these applications were to be approved, the impact would be devastating for Canterbury and its environment - one example is the endangered Canterbury Mudfish, which may suffer the loss of important habitat. The extraction of fossil fuels must be eliminated if we are to reach our goals laid out in the Zero Carbon Bill, and the reckless exploitation of our natural resources must cease.

Forest & Bird Youth urge you to decline all resource consent applications made by Bathurst Coal Limited.
