## **Reasons comment:**

- Climate change poses a risk to the future of Aotearoa and coal is a significant contributor

to global warming. (It is this I refer to when I say I am directly affected, below.) It's past time we keep coal in the ground. - The destruction of ecosystems that this application proposes is also a concern.
