Gary and Ann Dennison gave the Lower Waitaki Zone Committee a presentation on the Point Bush Ecosanctuary.

5.8 WAITAKI RIVER EROSION UPDATE - PETER BURT

Zone Committee Lead Peter Burt invited Waitaki Irrigation Collective Chairman Fraser McKenzie to speak on interest in the future state of the Waitaki River.

A discussion followed on the necessity at looking at the funding, science and mitigation work (possibility of future events) of the Waitaki River, legal review on upcoming renewal of Meridian compliance and consents (due 2023), the braided river management plan and Waitaki water management plan, terms of reference and empowering the River Rating Liaison Committee.

COMMITTEE RESOLUTION 2020/31

That the Lower Waitaki Zone Committee requests Environment Canterbury to undertake an urgent rating review of the Lower Waitaki Rating District, as previously agreed, and also prepare a revised Terms of Reference for the Waitaki River Rating Liaison Group that includes delegated responsibility to produce a proposed draft Terms of Reference with involvement from relevant stakeholders including Waitaki Irrigators Collective, Manawhenua and Meridian Energy.

This agenda item was postponed until 2021.

5.4 CHAIR'S REPORT – LOWER WAITAKI LETTER OF SHARED PRIORITIES

Bruce Murphy talked to the Committee about a meeting he had on Monday with Mayor Rowley and ECan Chair Jenny Hughey to discuss the Lower Waitaki and OTOP Letter of Shared Priorities and outcomes from the recent workshop. This meeting followed recent communications with the Chair of OTOP and Mayor Rowley.

The Committee expressed sadness of Emily Anderson's resignation and acknowledged her frustration.

Some members of the Committee highlighted frustrations of the purpose of the Lower Waitaki Zone Committee.

Brad Waldon-Gibbons (Tangata Whenua Facilitator) expressed his thoughts and opinions of working with other Zone Committees:

- ECan recommendations does not necessarily commit to expenditure
- Community-led action would be preferable and would achieve more than by staying in statutory space
- A lot of information is received (by way of presentations) but how do we use this for outcome on the ground?
- Intention of letter of shared priorities is to help refine Zone Committee actions

- Get industry <u>and</u> community representation on the Zone Committee ideally get people who are committed and aware of local projects
- Immediate Steps Project ideal to get projects from the Zone Committee up, not ECan down
- Action Plan needs to be owned by Zone Committee and guided by Letter of Priorities outlining tangible actions
- Themes are there, but no achievable outcomes/initiatives

The Zone Committee agreed their first workshop in 2021 would be used to plan an action plan, then hold a meeting to formalise the recommendations. All members to come to the workshop with one initiative from the priorities on Page 9 that they would like to see achieved.

Mayor Rowley is encouraging ECan to hold a public forum at end of February in the community to talk about the Essential Freshwater National Policy Statement, around the refresh time which may help to promote the Zone Committee refresh for members.

A discussion was held around OTOP receiving funding to support the preparation of government funding applications to, but not limited to, the 1 Billion Trees Partnership Fund and the Freshwater Improvement Fund.

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Lower Waitaki South Coastal Canterbury Water Zone Committee

Declaration of Interests Register – as at 9 July 2020 (Amended 17 December 2020)

Keeping a Zone Committee Members' declarations of interest register allows Zone Committees to identify and manage a conflict of interest when it arises.

The Office of the Auditor General notes a conflict of interest can arise when: "A members or official's duties or responsibilities to a public entity could be affected by some other interest or duty that the member or official may have."

If a member is in any doubt as to whether or not they have a conflict of interest, then the Member should seek guidance from Catherine Schache (General Counsel, Environment Canterbury), the Zone Facilitator and/or refer to the following guidance: https://www.oag.govt.nz/2010/lamia

Types of Interest to be documented in the register:

- Employment, trade or profession carried on by the Member or the Member's spouse for profit or gain
- Company, trust, partnership etc for which the Member or their spouse is a director, partner or trustee, or a shareholder of more than 10% shares
- Address of any land in which the Member has a beneficial interest and which is in the area of the Zone Committee
- The address of any land where the landlord is Environment Canterbury, Waimate
 District Council or Waitaki District Council and the Member or their spouse is a
 tenant; or
 - the land is tenanted by a firm in which the Member or spouse is a partner, a company of which the Member or spouse is a director, or a Trust of which the Member or spouse is a Trustee.
- Any other matters which the public might reasonably regard as likely to influence the Member's actions during the course of their duties as a Member.
- Any contracts held between the Member or the Member's spouse and Environment Canterbury, Waimate District Council or Waitaki District Council, including contracts in which the Member or their spouse is a partner, a company of which the spouse is a director and/or holds more than 10% in shares, or a Trust of which the Member or their spouse is a trustee (noting that no committee member should be a party to a contract with Environment Canterbury or Waimate or Waitaki District Council if that value is more than \$25,000 per annum)

Zone Committee members need to ensure that the information contained in this register is accurate and complete.

6. This two day interactive workshop creates a safe space for participants to explore the history of our place, Aotearoa, in order to understand the present and appreciate the relevance of the treaty personally and professionally, with particular focus on the environment.

Day 1 covers a basic understanding of the treaty, including; why we have a treaty, understanding of texts and implications, what happened post signing and where we are at now (treaty settlements, key contemporary events).

Day 2 is about deepening understanding, making links with past and present, the local story of Ngāi Tahu and understanding the imperative to respond with Te Tiriti as a guide for action.

- 7. Objectives, as a participant you will:
 - a. Understand why the Treaty is relevant and important to you personally, professionally and as a country
 - b. Be able to approach issues emanating from the Treaty of Waitangi with increasing confidence
 - c. Realise that contemporary Treaty issues and Māori/Pākehā relationships cannot be understood outside the context of history
 - d. Develop your own personal opinion; be aware of why you hold it; be open to developing insights
 - e. Be able to make connections between contemporary Treaty issues and historical events personal, national and international
 - f. Develop a level of critical analysis of public debate, including the role of the media, concerning the Treaty
 - g. Be aware of the effect that culture and racism (personal, cultural and institutional) has on self and others
 - h. Be able to recognise that the Treaty debate is an enriching process for New Zealand with the potential to create a stronger, more mature, united society
 - i. Be empowered to develop and maintain the Treaty relationship appropriate to your area of work
 - j. Honour Te Tiriti through practical implementation.
