Reasons comment:

Dust - Dust will not only be generated by the digging of the quarry it will also be generated by the movement of what Taggart's are claiming will be up to 250 truck movements per day along River Road, to and from the quarry and their yard. These trucks will be filled with shingle and the trucks themselves will be contaminated with the quarry dust, which

will be deposited into the air and surrounding areas irrespective of wind direction. The dust in this case is known to contain silica which is an established health hazard. The location of the quarry will put it far too close to populated/residential areas with a very real potential to impact residents and livestock's health, not only physical in terms of residents, but also the effects of mental health to those overlooking the quarry some homes being only some 200 meters away. Traffic - River Road is now far busier than before with the road having been sealed. With the claimed 250 truck movements per day comes the increase in danger for other road users, be it cars, motorbikes, cyclist, walkers or runners. This is an area used heavily for recreation and access to Ashley River/Rakahuri Regional Park. With the added movement of the trucks this will also increase the danger to the T-junction's between River Road and West Belt, Ballarat Road and Enverton Drive, with the claimed up to 10 truck and trailer movements to and from the site every 15 minutes producing the proposed up to 250 movements daily.
