Reasons comment:

I strongly oppose the application for a quarry to be established at the Rangiora Racecourse for a number of reasons, with the main ones being the dust and noise that this will create to neighbouring residential properties. The type of dust generated by this quarry work is the dangerous silica dust, which health professionals, such as the CDHB say can be toxic to

humans and they also say that quarries should not be established near residential properties. This quarry literally backs onto residential houses, how can anyone think that this is a good idea?
