live. We have been seeing more native birds around our neighbourhood and live in hope to one day see more in our mature trees. The heavy machinery will also have an impact on our already suffering roads. This would take funding from the upgrades and repairs so evidently needed and lacking in our town. The noise pollution will affect those living nearby and will not be mitigated by any bunding. Whilst we understand Quarrying was in River Rd at a rural site, Rangiora has grown and will continue to grow exponentially over the next years and this Quarry will affect all who live and are hoping to build in these rural and semi rural now urban areas. We note that NO timeframe for the quarrying is mentioned. How many years or decades will this quarry operate and how will this affect the growth and charm of these suburbs in Rangiora. Frankly there must be other sites in a less residential and potential residential areas. Have other alternative sites been sought? Or is the financial benefit and or need to some the overriding factor. We understand that the quarry would be directly above our secondary groundwater catchment area and if we endure any further serious earthquakes this ground water would be needed. Although the proposal is to keep 1 metre above the groundwater, there is no way to stop any potential disruption and or pollution of the aquifer.
