Reasons comment:

Operational noise - We live directly down wind of the North and Northwest wind, very strong at times and this unrelenting noise would be unbearable to live within. Even now on Race days this noise is easily heard. Dust - that is likely to contain extremely fine silica which travels a long way and be damaging to health and property. The Northwest wind

covers a lot of property. Water - Likely contamination from various types of unpoliced unknown back fill. At various times of the year water levels could be as high as 1 metre from surface and shingle extraction to 5 metres very detrimental to all. Options: Forming a Quarry within the Rangiora Racecourse is not a good enough reason to help financially secure its future. Other Racecourses around the Country have had to close and centralise, to survive. We recognise the present and future use of aggregate will forever be needed but makes no sense to dig it out of the ground beside the Ashley River as there is a never ending source of shingle coming down . Extraction of shingle does help relieve the build up and increases the rivers holding capacity We recognise the bird nesting season in the Ashley River but this can be managed and should be without protest. Extraction from this part of the River can be moved during this time. Stockpile Storage - If Taggart Earthmoving is running out of future storage space, E-Can could consent to the Company some of the adjoining land on their North boundary recently cleared of trees. The dust level would then be moved down parallel to the River as it does now.
