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Lower Waitaki South Coastal Canterbury Zone Committee

Action Plan 2021-2023

Purpose: to uphold the mana of the freshwater bodies within Lower Waitaki South Coastal Canterbury by facilitating enduring land and water management solutions that give effect to the Canterbury Water Management Strategy vision, principles and targets in our zone.

The desired outcome of the CWMS is "To enable present and future generations to gain the greatest social, economic, recreational and cultural benefits from our water resources within an environmentally sustainable framework."



Functions:

Facilitate community engagement and collaboration – continuing an active programme of engaging with communities on freshwater management matters; and

Facilitate the provision of advice through to councils (relevant Territorial Authorities and Environment Canterbury) and others (e.g. private sector) contributing to freshwater management; and

Action Plan 2021 - 2023 - How we will deliver on our commitments

1. Kaitiakitanga, Wāhi Taonga and mahika kai Targets

Working alongside landowners, Rūnaka, communities, and others to inspire and grow support and resources to achieve the 2025 mahika kai goal of **five mahika kai projects** in each zone.

We will:

- •Kaitiakitanga will be the heart of all ZC actions overarching principle in all the Committees actions
- •Take opportunities to increase our knowledge of te Ao Mãori (Mãori world view) including Tikanga, te reo, Mãtauranga Mãori and mahika kai.
- *Led by rūnaka, work closely with, councils, government agencies, the local community and landowners to identify and champion mahika kai projects across the zone including working with Waihao Wainono Catchment Community Group, Hakataramea Sustainability Collective, community groups such as the Point Bush Eco Sanctuary, Northern Streams community, government agencies and industry

2. Ecosystem Health and Biodiversity Targets

Working alongside landowners, Rūnanga, communities, councils and others to inspire and grow support and resources to achieve the 2025 target goal covering all **freshwater ecosystems** through;

- o increased riparian management to protect aquatic ecosystems
- o reducing the number of fish barriers in the zone
- o protection and enhancement of named wetlands

We will:

- *Stocktake all existing riparian, fish barrier and wetland projects to understand fully what has been achieved. Then work with rūnanga, landowners and the local community to identify and champion new projects which provide the most benefit for water quality in the zone. The focus may be on:
 - o the lower Waitaki river (possible involvement in future Braided River Revival Plan).
 - o The Waihao river and Wainono
 - O Urban stormwater, urban streams (e.g. Stormwater Superheroes)
- *Engage/communicate with community on projects

3. Recreation and Amenity Targets

Working alongside landowners, Rūnanga, communities, Councils and others to support and grow resources to achieve the 2025 target to restore priority freshwater recreation opportunities in each zone that do not meet contact recreation standards, and developing plans and actions to achieve and show measurable progress

We will:

- *Identify waterways that do not meet contact recreation standards (from LAWA, ECan, TAs, INZ Know your Catchment)
- •Support the work already underway on the Waihao River by the Waihao Wainono Catchment Community Group
- •Support and encourage community groups to develop plans and implement and actions to achieve improvement in other catchments, focussing initially on water quality in Northern Streams catchment
- 4. Promoting & encouraging the responsible use of our water resources to sustain the four wellbeings identified in the Local Government Act "Purpose" clause for TLAs (improving the social, economic, environmental and cultural well-being of our communities).

We will:

Have regard to the four wellbeings in all activities and decisions in conjunction with Te Mana o Te Wai and the CWMS order
of priorities.

Notes from Workshop: Overarching – te mana o te wai, Kaitiakitanga, engagement plan(s) for each action (utilise ECan and TA expertise) Action: See if Jenny Hughey can come down and speak on EFW and what it means.  - *Telling the real story (consistent clear messages) and advocating for change
 - *Involving schools through Enviroschools and other direct engagement

We will:

- •Working with councils, industry and community groups (e.g. South Canterbury Catchment Collective) encourage timely education/information sharing.
- •Develop and maintain close networks with farming community. Listening for issues, advocating where appropriate and raise the flags with relevant support networks and authorities when appropriate.
- *Participate in the review of the Waitaki Water Allocation Plan as appropriate

 - Schools

- *Advocate for funded "Catchment Coordinator" to set up and sustain catchment groups

 - •Work with runanga, Waihao Wainono Catchment Community Group and the local community to identify and champion projects across the catchment.

 - Investigate urban impact on Wainono and work with Waimate District Council to develop and deliver education programme/community engagement.
 - •Keep abreast of industry initiatives such as augmentation proposals.

- Encourage the improvement of recreational opportunities along the Waitaki River and promotion (including signage) access, manawhenua values and history, mahika kai, biodiversity and Waitaki Whitestone Geopark

CHAIR'S REPORT - BRUCE MURPHY

Kate White reported spraying work is currently being undertaken on the Waitaki River.

The Chair presented at the WIC Forum on Monday on the Lower Waitaki Zone Committee and upcoming Committee Refresh. His key takeaway was a consensus between all irrigation schemes to come up with one environmental standard. This is to be discussed further with management of each scheme to see if we can get it to a practical level.

The Chair, Zone Facilitator and Zone Lead had a positive meeting with Janet Gregory from MPI about facilitator funding. MPI ae looking at funding budgets for the 2021/22 financial year and were interested in our thoughts and needs. The scale and availability of funding being provided to MPI will be confirmed in July. They indicated interest in applications which combined funding and see the value in catchment coordination.

The Chair talked to John Benn (DOC), who put us onto Brad Edwards as a contact to understand DOC's position in the Braided River Revival Plan.

The Chair updated members on a letter Mayor of Hurunui wrote to the Hurunui Zone Committee Chairman on shared priorities and will seek advice from Ken Hughey, Chairman of Hurunui Zone on what they did and progress. There are some strong similarities between Hurunui and Lower Waitaki Zone Committee priorities.

The Office of the Auditor General notes a conflict of interest can arise when: "A member's or official's duties or responsibilities to a public entity could be affected by some other interest or duty that the member or official may have."

If a member is in any doubt as to whether or not they have a conflict of interest, then the Member should seek guidance from Catherine Schache (General Counsel, Environment Canterbury), the Zone Facilitator and/or refer to the following guidance: https://www.oag.govt.nz/2010/lamia

Types of Interest to be documented in the register:

- 1. Employment, trade or profession carried on by the Member or the Member's spouse for profit or gain
- 2. Company, trust, partnership etc for which the Member or their spouse is a director, partner or trustee, or a shareholder of more than 10% shares
- 3. Address of any land in which the Member has a beneficial interest and which is in the area of the Zone Committee
- 4. The address of any land where the landlord is Environment Canterbury, Waimate District Council or Waitaki District Council and the Member or their spouse is a tenant; or the land is tenanted by a firm in which the Member or spouse is a partner, a company of which the Member or spouse is a director, or a Trust of which the Member or spouse is a Trustee.
- 5. Any other matters which the public might reasonably regard as likely to influence the Member's actions during the course of their duties as a Member.
- 6. Any contracts held between the Member or the Member's spouse and Environment Canterbury, Waimate District Council or Waitaki District Council, including contracts in which the Member or their spouse is a partner, a company of which the spouse is a director and/or holds more than 10% in shares, or a Trust of which the Member or their spouse is a trustee (noting that no committee member should be a party to a contract with Environment Canterbury or Waimate or Waitaki District Council if that value is more than \$25,000 per annum)

Zone Committee members need to ensure that the information contained in this register is accurate and complete.

PURPOSE

1. To consider the option of co-opting Chris Batstone onto the Lower Waitaki South Coastal Canterbury Zone Committee for a fixed term.

BACKGROUND

- 2. The Committee is losing considerable experience over the next few months:
 - a. At the end of June, Daniel Isbister will finish
 - b. 21 April will be the last meeting for Barney Hoskins, who is moving out of the district
 - Emily Anderson finished at the end of last year.
 - From July the Committee will have new Community Representatives, but they will take time to get up to speed with the zone
- 3. From April to July the Committee will be highly engaged in developing its detailed action plans. From July onwards the focus will be on implementation which will likely involve increased community engagement.
- 4. The Committee agrees that establishing and supporting catchment groups will be key to achieving real progress within the zone.
- 5. Previously the Committee has co-opted a community member (Emily Anderson) to provide specific expertise and experience.
- 6. The Zone Committee's Terms of Reference provides for co-opting members. "Any Committee may co-opt such other expert or advisory members as it deems necessary to ensure it's able to achieve it purpose. Any such co-option will be on a non-voting basis."

PROPOSAL

- 7. That the Committee co-opts Chris Batstone for a period of six to nine months to bolster the Committee's resources during the time that the Committee has fewer experienced members and will be inducting new members and developing its Action Plan.
- 8. Chris is a Senior Resource & Environmental Economist and holds a PhD from the University of Auckland's School of Biological Sciences. He is currently the Coordinator for the Waihao Wainono Catchment Community Group (WWCCG) and would provide an important link between the Zone Committee and WWCGG, along with real-world experience in supporting catchment groups.
- 9. Chris has been approached, and is happy to be co-opted on to the Committee.

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10. Chris would be paid the standard Community Representative honorarium but would not have voting rights.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Lower Waitaki SCC Zone Committee consider this proposal and decide whether to recommend co-opting Chris Batstone to the Committee for a period of six to nine months.
