# What do you feel are the significant challenges and opportunities we face?

We are involved in farming and for us the biggest challenge is the increased regulation and complexity of these regulations monitored by multiple organizations who do not communicate with each other for privacy reasons. I spent endless amounts of time filling in forms and surveys which in the end in general achieve very little, particular around desired outcomes. We need a more carrot type approach. KPI's in general achieve outcomes.

One of the biggest problems is that some of the regulation is based on poor research or the hope that science will bring solutions where our opinion is that you only can make regulation on confirmed science. As an example you want to electrify the buses and I do not totally disagree with that option for noise control, but if you do not take the carbon foot printing of the battery and the disposal of it in to consideration you are fooling yourself. Carbon cycles do not stop at the border. In my opinion hydrogen buses would be a much better option.

Implementing the freshwater package. This is a rushed approach and Ecan should push much harder back to government who if no change is made to the regulation will cripple parts of Canterbury if not all of it. We already spent 60 million developing community plans. It is an insult on the processes we went through and it will turn ratepayers away from democracy

We like to see a considered and measured implementation of a low emission transport network. If you want people to use public transport you need frequency and from early morning till late. We only see this working in Central Christchurch. The bus taxi may be a better solution for other parts of Canterbury. On the low emission thing , you had a natural gas system going before the earthquake from methane derived from sewage, but somebody knocked it on the head. Christchurch City Council??

Pest control is essential, but if it is government that introduced the pest (wilding pines) it is their job to fix it. If they use Ecan as a contractor that is fine.

Flood protection and infrastructure is paramount to keep the rate payers safe.

If you keep producing rules left right and center you need more and more compliance officers.

Streamlining compliance in programs like "Lead with Pride" make life easier for all involved.

Totally support you on active regeneration of the natural environment and tree planting programs. his is where can engage with youth through schools and businesses who want to do their bit for a more diverse landscape.

Education is not for Ecan but should be an Ministry for Education issue. We have to keep some boundaries else you are going to be everything for everybody and everybody will be confused. Data collection. Must do is fine and it has to make sense. There is lots of data collected with no purpose.
