LTP - Fees and Charges Policy (p.268).

I object strongly to the punitive levy proposed in the Long-term ECAN Plan to charge law-abiding mooring owners for the cost of removing derelict vessels.

Removing such vessels is primarily the responsibility of the owner, and if they are unable for any reason, then it is a valued responsibility of ECAN acting for rate-payers as a whole.

An example: A trailer load of rubbish was dumped on the road verge outside my property. Should I be responsible for removing it? Or is it the responsibility of the whole street? or one side of the street, or road users, or the manufacturers of materials in the rubbish, or... In practise it was dealt with very efficiently by the City Council refuse collection team.

I'm comfortable paying for my share of this service as a rate-payer, but not targeted as a mooring holder.
