Water and Land portfolio comments:

I am concerned that ECan are rolling over existing irrigation consents and issuing consents for water bottling with no public consultation.

The National Policy Statement for Freshwater Management 2020 strengthens and clarifies Te Mana o te Wai by providing stronger direction on how Te Mana o te Wai should be applied when managing freshwater.

Regional councils must give effect to Te Mana o te Wai by actioning the five key requirements of Te Mana o te Wai - for example, regional councils must apply the hierarchy of obligations when implementing the NPS-FM 2020.

This hierarchy means prioritising the health and well-being of water first. The second priority is the health needs of people (such as drinking water) and the third is the ability of people and communities to provide for their social, economic and cultural well-being.

ECan by rolling over existing irrigation consents and issuing consents for water bottling with no public consultation is bypassing and ignoring the first two hierarchies of Te Mana o te Wai and now that we have a democratically elected Council steps must be taken to immediately correct this fault.

Other initiatives in relation to this portfolio are:

- 1. Scrap any further funding of Managed Aquifer Recharge projects. At best they are just robbing Peter to pay Paul, and a licence to continue polluting.
- 2. Set aside funds (probably under the Freshwater Regulation Framework) to investigate ways in which we can legally strengthen our Regional Plan to ensure no new water bottling consents can be granted, and to block the conversion of existing consents.
- 3. Set aside funds (probably under Regional and Strategic Leadership) for programs to convert dairy farms to alternative land uses, including employing or engaging experts in regenerative land and farming practices, community engagement, advocacy to central Government and lobbying for funding.
- 4. Set aside funds to drive a review of the Canterbury Water Management Strategy to bring it into consistency with Te Mana o te Wai, including removing any support for increased irrigation.

Biodiversity and Biosecurity portfolio comments:

Our very existence is dependent on the survival of our biodiversity. Allowing large scale irrigation and intensive farming practices along with the associated synthetic nitrogen fertilisers to continue is destroying our rivers and streams and associated biodiversity to the stage where most of our native fauna is near extinct or endangered.

We must reverse these practices and encourage alternative land uses such as regenerative farming and returning the Canterbury plains to its natural "dryland" state along with its associated dryland crops.

Climate Change and Community Resilience portfolio comments:

I welcome the climate education funding in option 1, and would like more climate education and for it to emphasise need for collective action and systemic change, rather than individual consumer changes. I believe that Te Tiriti compliant participatory and deliberative democracy on a local level will be crucial in our climate response, and that Ecan should be trialling these sorts of initiatives

Air Quality, Transport and Urban Development portfolio comments:

I would like more funding to develop mass rapid transport. I support cheap or free public transport, and raising the age at which young people pay adult rates. I would like cycling and public transport to be prioritised more over car use.
