I agree with the general directions of the plan. One thing I think has not had enough emphasis, or even consideration, is ECan working with local councils to agree on designated land use according to regional soil types etc. I think this is necessary because too much fertile arable land in places like Lincoln and Prebbleton and north of Christchurch is being covered with housing, thereby reducing future food security. We cannot continue to allow good arable land to be covered in houses. Places like Rolleston with its shallow soils and stony land are ideal for housing (apart from the incessant wind!).

### Water and Land portfolio comments:

With regard to land, see above comments. In addition, helping farmers and city dwellers to understand how their activities are impacting the environment is an absolutely necessary activity. In the city, people are building with copper that is polluting the waterways and life within them. On farms, farmers are doing their best, but need help to understand how riparian plantings will influence runoff into waterways, and how their current farming systems and support software such as Overseer do little to discourage high N inputs that result in nitrate leaching into our aquifers.

With regard to water, nitrate leaching is turning into a massive timebomb and Ecan and the government will have to work hard to turn this around. Farmers will need local and national support to do this. It has been known since the first scientific studies in the 1970's that nitrate leaching will become a problem and nothing has been done by successive governments.

### **Biodiversity and Biosecurity portfolio comments:**

Perhaps a major biodiversity target should be to turn Canterbury's plains from one massive monocultural dairying operation, into more diverse farming activities with less impact on the environment and water use.

Also, the natural high and flow cycles of our rivers used to do much to keep the rivers and river beds clear of algae, weeds etc. and keep the water healthy. Intense irrigation has taken water away from these waterways, and flows are low and stay low. As a result Ecan has to carry out spraying programmes and these are not a good look. Combined with nitrate, phosphate and bacterial pollution, the rivers are now a mess and don't support water life like they used to and people can't use them for fear of being poisoned by toxic algae.

# Climate Change and Community Resilience portfolio comments:

See my comments regarding the need for designated land use action. This would also include clarity around the impacts of sea levels rising and flooding low lying areas. People need to be made more aware of this and strategic withdrawal encouraged by Ecan and CCC. Also, with current climate change scenarios, sharing our precious fresh water for everyone's benefit and environmental benefits, not just commercial benefit, becomes essential. I saw in the Canterbury Museum that more than 50% of Canterbury's water is used for irrigation. That is, commercial benefit. In general. people are not buying into the old 'economic benefit' arguments any more. What about social and environmental benefits?

### Air Quality, Transport and Urban Development portfolio comments:

I came down from the North Island to live and work in Christchurch in 1983 and back then the air quality in in the city was disgusting during the colder months. Ecan and CCC have done well to make air quality so much better now and I hope the same can be achieved for water quality. I'd like to see a much more flexible transport system and the on-demand model sounds good in principle. I also ask for more options, including light rail that uses existing infrastructure to be in the mix. Smaller buses

might also be a good option if combined with more frequent services, greater numbers of buses (shuttles), and greater ease of use. By the latter I mean taking a leaf out of how European bus services operate with their 'Next stop' displays in every bus and on-board route maps to help people get around. This could be implemented as part of the tendering process, whereby successful tenderers would have to incorporate these more user-friendly features in their buses/shuttles. And please, listen to the community. I think it was disgraceful that Ecan took the bus service further away from the retirement village in Papanui.
