Dear Environment Canterbury

At 4.07pm on Sunday the 11th April your online 'Have your say' on the LTP system would not allow me to save and continue, I could only go back and each time I went backward I was unable to go forward.

I have summarised the main points of the Waihora Ellesmere Trust submission below and **look** forward to the opportunity of speaking to the submission at a hearing.

This submission is made on behalf of the Waihora Ellesmere Trust.

The Trust is a Charitable Trust with the health of Te Waihora/Lake Ellesmere its environs and tributaries at the core of its purpose for existing. Its interests lie primarily within Christchurch City and Selwyn District, but the international connectedness of the species that are part of the Lake ecosystem means we have interests in isues beyond the immediate district and regional councils.

The Trust's membership is open to anyone and the Trustees are all elected by the membership.

It operates an open webpage Through this it supports science, effective management, networks and community education and facilitates action.

The Trust has almost two decades of experience as a community organisation often working very closely with Environment Canterbury in a variety of projects and processes.

The Trust is pleased to see the ongoing commitment in the LTP to deliver on improved freshwater and ecosystems management and environmental education - all of which we have assisted with in the past.

Over the last financial year the Trust has been reviewing the current state of play in actions in the catchment. The considerable demographic changes occurring in the catchment coupled with the move to increase the recreational and in-country tourism options that covid has forced, has led us to focus on making Lake Ellesmere more accessible. This primarily to engage new settlers in the catchment with the Lake and its internationally significant values, promote understanding and action. We also anticipate it serving a wider NZ community through additional things to do while vacationing in the region.

Research by Lincoln University (at the Trust's request) has shown that people appreciate the Lake's values more when they have visited it than if they have not, and they are more likely to engage with it positively if there are attractions.

Over a decade ago the Trust published an brochure with a map providing information on access to the Lake and associated information. We now see an opportunity to increase the accessibility to the Lake and provide additional options to encourage recreation, tourism and general

engagement with the Lake in a way that promotes healthy recreation.

We intend to establish additional cycle/walkways to facilitate access to and along the Lake with the ultimate goal of enabling a circum-lake route. We are therefore seek that funds be set aside in the LTP and the annual plan to assist that to occur. These additional walkways/cycleways would include associated biodiversity improvements and educational opportunities. As important is that they would enable community members opportunities for active engagement in restoration activities and recreation and learning in places currently inaccessible in a practical sense.

We are therefore supportive of community funds being made available to assist with specific projects as proposed in the LTP.

The Trust looks forward to continuing to work with ECan over the coming years on a number of ongoing projects, notably with the biennial **Living Lake Symposium** the first of which was held in 2007. The next one is scheduled for November 2021 and **we request that the Council budget make adequate provision for supporting the Symposium** as it has in the past, both in kind and in cash. This should be part of the ongoing operational budget and not a community fund project.

In the past the Trust has employed a manager to assist in obtaining and administering funds and operationalising projects. This has enabled the Trust to bring significant funds from outside the region to assist with projects like environmental restoration. The ability of voluntary community organisations to achieve these outcomes is largely due to **grant funds that are not tied to specific projects**. We consider such grants funding to support community groups operationally is something that ECan needs to consider as a means to support communities to engage and develop projects.

We are pleased to see inclusion of funding for the overdue revamp of the regional coastal plan. Te Waihora lies within the coastal environment and is opened directly into the coastal marine area we look forward to working with ECan on the coastal plan as it moves forward.

We also remain committed to participating with the Lake opening protocol and other initiatives by ECan to build the cooperation with other groups and agencies working for similar or related goals to those of the Trust within the catchment.

As the Trust does not own land and does not pay rates it is inappropriate for it to comment on such areas or express a preference for either of the options presented in the LTP discussion document, or otherwise comment on matters outside the ambit of the Trusts Objects.
