Subject:	Reducing emissions via a well-utilised low-emissions public transport network.

Our public transport system with mostly large bus's, some electric, but with very few passengers is undoubtably running at a loss.

Public transport should be under 1 authority and be an intergrated service.

Over the last few years commuters, have used E.bikes, E scooters and even E skates or roller blades as a way to work and school. There are young children who use scooters, and older teenagers on bicycles.

However many primary school children are driven to school and picked up after school, which makes for traffic congestion twice a day.

However Christchurch has a North to South and East to West single track railway, which is seldom used by Kiwi rail. It makes sense to trial the under used rail corridor. I invisage temporary containers as stations, with appropriate second track to allow trains to pass. Rolling stock would need to be refurbished. This is really a trial to see if it is viable. We are the 3rd city in NZ and growing. Auckland & Wellington although they have issues with their network, are not shutting down their urban rail.

Bus's have a catchment which unloads & picks up passengers.

I see the introduction of rail transport as reducing the commute time, to do the heavy lifting of E bikes, bicycles, heavy goods, ease traffic congestion, and reducing carbon emissions.
