7.1 Appointment of Hearing Commissioner – SOL Screening and Crushing Ltd

Councillor McKay asked about submission working days and was advised it was twenty days. Ms Schache said that the Resource Management Act provided guidance in the waiving of a timeframe to accept a late submission. She noted that correspondence had been received from the applicant in regard to the late submission.

Councillor Edge requested clarification about gravel applications. Ms Grant advised that the river engineers provided comment on gravel applications and that council followed the policies outlined in the gravel strategy.

Councillor Marshall asked about the submitter. It was advised that the submitter was Te Rūnanga o Kaikoura who were limited notified of the application.

#### Resolved

#### Resolved

  - 1.1 Appoints Sharon McGarry as a Hearings Commissioner;
  - 1.2 Appoints Hoani Langsbury as a Hearings Commissioner;
  - 1.3 Appoints Kenneth Lawn as a Hearings Commissioner; and
  - 1.4 Appoints Bianca Sullivan as a Hearings Commissioner,

each of them acting severally, to consider and decide the non-notification, limited notification or public notification of resource consent applications received from:

- a) sections within Environment Canterbury;
- b) Environment Canterbury staff members, Environment Canterbury Councillors and Tumu Taiao, and family members of those people;

- d) applicants where Environment Canterbury or its staff would have a conflict of interest or perceived conflict of interest; and
- 2. following any decision made under paragraph (1):
  - 2.1 if that decision is not to notify the consent application, to consider and decide that consent application; and
  - 2.2 if that decision is to limited notify or to publicly notify that consent application, to sit as sole commissioner; or as Chair or member of a hearing panel in conjunction with other Hearing Commissioners to be appointed at a later date; to consider and decide that consent application; and
- 3. Delegates to each of the people named in paragraphs 1.1 to 1.4, the function, powers and duties required to: deal with any preliminary matters; consider, and subject to the appointment of additional Hearing Commissioners set out in paragraph 2.2, to decide any such applications.

### **Purpose**

 To nominate an Expert Consenting Panel Member under the Fast-Track Consenting Pathway.

#### Recommendations

That the Regulation Hearing Committee in regard to the Faringdon South West and South East Development Expert Consenting Panel nominates Janette Dovey.

## **Background**

- 2. Environment Canterbury has received a request from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for a nominee in relation to the Faringdon South West and South East Development Expert Consenting Panel. The EPA has asked the Council to make its nomination by 31 May 2021.
- Faringdon South West and South East Development is a specific project that was listed in the COVID-19 Recovery (Fast-track Consenting) Act 2020 (Fast-track Consenting Act).
- 4. The scope of the project at Rolleston is to subdivide land and construct
  - a) either—
    - (i) a subdivision of up to 1,089 lots and 1,087 residential units; or
    - (ii) if a secondary school is developed in the location of the project, a subdivision of up to 959 lots and 957 residential units; and
  - b) 2 commercial centres; and
  - c) recreation reserves; and
  - d) the associated infrastructure for the subdivision and development, including roading, walking, and cycling infrastructure, and three waters services.
- 5. The EPA has sought nominations to the panel from both Environment Canterbury and Selwyn District Council.

- 6. The Panel Convenor chooses one nominee from those nominated by the relevant local authorities so ideally the local authorities consult to reach a consensus and nominate the same person. If no nomination is made the Environmental Protection Agency will appoint a person with the appropriate skills and experience to be a member of the panel.
- 7. Any nominee must be accredited under the Ministry for the Environment 'Making Good Decisions' programme.
- 8. Environment Canterbury has liaised with Selwyn District Council. The district council wish to nominate Janette Dovey.
- 9. Janette Dovey has a wide breadth of experience in the various aspects of planning and resource management with a particular focus on work in the Selwyn and Christchurch areas through her consultancy Bellbird Consulting Group Limited. She is a full member of the New Zealand Planning Institute.
- 10. She is accredited as an independent hearing commissioner and has sat as a sole commissioner and as a panel member on a number of panels. She has covered a wide range of topic areas and legislative frameworks including the Resource Management Act resource consents and plan changes, the Canterbury Earthquake Recovery Act (CERA), the Housing Accords and Special Housing Areas Act and the Local Government Act (LGA). She has also made a large number of decisions on non-notified resource consent applications for local authorities.
- 11. It is recommended that the Environment Canterbury nominates the same person as the Selwyn District Council. The proposal itself covers mainly district council matters, and regional council matters relating to stormwater.
