	 On 17th of November Council endorsed approval of the independent panel on the PC7 and PC2 – has now passed and staff are working their way through that. Part of integrated plan that needs to be completed by 2024. Submissions against PC7 and PC2 close on the 15th December. Any appeals will need to be heard soon. Endorsed the refresh of Zone Committees at meeting on 		
	the 25 th of November.		

Emissions reduction plan has gone to government with submissions from ECan. Have begun process of looking at 2022/23 annual plan, early draft will be completed by Christmas, will be endorsed mid to late February. Ngai Tahu representation bill passed its first reading in Government, now goes through select committee process. Co-designing integrated plan on fresh water with Ngai Tahu and local rūnanga. Cllr. Mackenzie gave an update to Council on what's going on in the Central Biosecurity Advisory Group area. 3. **Public Forum** Cllr. Edge 3.1 Opportunity for public engagement with the BAG No public in attendance. 4. **Main Discussion Items** Laurence Smith 4.1 Regional and local programmes update Update report sent out taken as read. Laurence ran through some points. Regional update Velvet leaf – MPI's focus is turning to long term management, the funding will only be in place until June 2023, decisions will need to be made before then about what's happening with the programme. Haven't had many reports of velvet leaf in recent times. A lot of areas that had it are still in pasture, may see a re-emergence when they're put back into crop – a matter of wait and see. Feral animals – as discussed at last meeting, increasing problem with pigs/deer/goats. Currently bid before Government for funding to control ungulates. High level meeting has been delayed, but DOC is keen to meet soon. Draft framework that will help with discussions about management of ungulates will be available early next year. Comment re need for control of feral cats/mustelids as well -Pest free 2050.

Discussion re adding feral cats etc added to the table to be discussed with DOC.

Comment re overarching pest management plan with targeted responses to ungulates, feral cats, mustelids, rodents etc – this is where connecting community groups comes in.

- Check, Clean, Dry 2 advocates have been on board for a couple of weeks. This year with Covid a lot of events have been cancelled, has given us an opportunity for our advocates to reach out to groups that we aren't usually able too. Programme is subsidised by MPI.
- 'Space Invaders' Parliamentary Report from the Commissioner for the Environment, review of weed management, widespread weeds that have become a problem. A lot of expertise went into it, highly recommend people read it.

Comment re difference between the number of introduced species vs the number of natives.

Local update

- Puna grass, some work has been done, majority will happen after Christmas.
- Boneseed control has been undertaken mostly in Kaikoura with some around Motunau and Gore Bay.
- Bur daisy most of that will be undertaken after Christmas, infestation is pretty much under control.
- Chilean Needle Grass work started on that in mid-November, 2 new sites were found, both connected to existing properties, so not unexpected. Cold weather means we are expecting plants to keep appearing possibly through to March. 3 of the properties with larger infestations have engaged their own contractor to deal with CNG, we have stepped away, now just auditing the contractor.
- Saffron thistle haven't found much so far, expecting to find some more in next year.

Question re newspaper articles on tensions in community with ECan, has this affected any of the above work?

Not at this stage – might in the future as there is one occupier with a significant nassella issue and a small Chilean Needle grass issue but at this stage looks ok for access.
