A discussion was held on the correct pronunciation of Te Waikākahi and Waitāhuna, and the process of having the names changed to reflect the true meanings.

5.4 CHAIR'S UPDATE

RECOMMENDATION

Note:

- The Waihao River is running well
- Recent Zone Committee Chairs and Deputies Hui at Arowhenua Marae was positive
- Held Waikakahi/Northern Fan initial meeting with key stakeholders, which was very positive
- Planning a MGI Greenhouse Gas Shareholders Information Workshop in December.
- Jonts McKerrow, Waimate District Council's Regulatory and Compliance Group Manager, spoke on the Freshwater Management Hui being held tomorrow (21 October)

5.6 DEMONSTRATION OF 'KNOW YOUR CATCHMENT' PLATFORM – VIA ZOOM

Fraser McKenzie explained the platform was previously an Irrigation New Zealand initiative to engage and learn about freshwater, and has been picked up by the Waitaki Irrigators Collective, updated and developed further to make it a tool that reflects current situation. A WIC subcommittee 'Environmental Stewardship Group' will continue developing the tool.

Craig Evans, MGI, (via zoom) presented on the 'Know Your Catchment Platform' and how the programme works.

The Zone Committee recognised this is a good platform for Zone Committee and Catchment Groups to start using in the community, i.e., a baseline for future conversation; however a small informal working group will meet before the next Zone Committee meeting, and discuss:

- a. simplifying the data into user-friendly language
- b. format
- c. outcomes / delivery

The Zone Committee would be happy to brief both Waimate and Waitaki Councils on the 'Know your Catchment' Platform.

5.7 THREE WATERS REFORM UPDATE: WAIMATE AND WAITAKI MAYORS - 2:00PM

Waimate and Waitaki Mayors Craig Rowley and Gary Kircher updated the Lower Waitaki Zone Committee on the current position with the Three Waters Reform, the Waimate and Waitaki Councils' stance, and lead discussion on water quality standards, wastewater treatment schemes and plants. With the deadline for feedback from councils passed, a decision is expected within the next few days from the Minister of Local Government.

The Zone Committee agreed that everybody wants to have better water, but how this is achieved needs further work.

5.5 REGIONAL COUNCIL UPDATE

- Ngai Tahu Representation Bill has been publicly notified. If it passes its first reading, it will be referred to a Select Committee where people will have the opportunity to provide their feedback on the content of the Bill.
- Overseer agreement has been achieved between Ngai Tahu and ECan through a consultant with the consenting process recommencing soon.
- A co-design process has been agreed between Ngai Tahu and ECan which will utilise an independent organisation. Planning for the next generation Land and Water Regional Plan soon to get underway, have to have new plan notified by December 2024. This will set pathways to meet new Freshwater Limits, and will build on existing work done.

5.8 ZONE COMMITTEE UPDATE – DAVE MOORE

 Waikakiahi/Northern Fan Critical Source Mapping: Tom Byrne updated the Committee on progress. Goal to engage with at least 50% land owners in all of Northern Fan. Proposing a collaborate approach with MGI to help with engagement. Trying to be proactive as water quality in the past has been poor, it is important to form relationships and buy-in from landowners to achieve long term changes.

That the Lower Waitaki Zone Committee give authority to Bruce Murphy, as Chair, to endorse support for the Waikakiahi/Northern Fan Critical Source Mapping initiative in communications through Environment Canterbury's Land Management Advisor Tom Bryne and Biodiversity Officer Kennedy Lange.

- Strawberry Fare trailer organised with interest from Waimate High School, and Zone Committee members invited to participate. Councillor Fox and the facilitator will consult with Waimate District Council staff on stormwater initiatives.
- The 17 November meeting will be a workshop to informally discuss:
 - Knowing Your Catchment
 - > Progress with Waikakahi/Northern Fan Critical Source Mapping
 - Preparing a draft budget of \$50,000
- The December meeting may be a field trip with Christmas lunch possibly in the upper Waitaki part of the zone.
