[1] We need a train network with a line connecting Rolleston-City Centre-Rangiora, as well as a train between the Airport and City Centre to reduce reliance on carbon-intensive methods of travel (e.g. fossil fuel vehicles) and buses will not cut it. [2] We need Levees and water drainage infrastructure to protect our communities from significant flooding. Even today a hard rain shows that just basic water drainage is insufficient and scarce in much of Canterbury. [3] To encourage more bicycle commuting, we need a network of *separated cycleways* (with trees planted alongside where possible) to connect the suburbs and satellite towns to Christchurch City Centre, even as far away as Rolleston and Rangiora. Current cycle lanes are often insufficient and dangerous. [4] The red-zone and wet lands of Christchurch should be turned into reserves with native tree planting, so that land which is more likely to be impacted by coastal inundation, flooding, or earthquakes can be made into a natural and beautiful buffer to climate change and natural disaster risks.
