For people with limited funds and who also may be vulnerable members of society, a targeted fare-free approach would make transport affordable to people who may have to prioritise spending and would provide transport options for people who could otherwise not afford it at all. Perhaps most importantly though, it would offer safety in the form of transport which, by being communal, may also avoid vulnerable people being taken advantage of where they might be at risk in a one-on-one situation (such as in a taxi or an Uber). Targeted fare-free would be the best thing Environment Canterbury has done in years for public transport, in my opinion. It would prompt me to use the bus again.
